Horror films, TV shows, books, and comics have always attempted to bring us to the threshold of our fears and force us to come face to face with the "otherness" that exists outside of the mainstream. For those in the LGBTQ+ community, this sense of otherness is not only terrifying and titillating, it's quite often also relatable. From James Whales' Frankenstein to the oft-cited "gayest movie of all time," A Nightmare on Elm Street 2, we're posing the question: Does a queer horror genre exist, and if so what makes it different from mainstream horror? And how does the current social movement for LGBTQ+ and BIPOC diversity inform the creation of the horror comics, films, and television shows we see today?
